

## HOW THE AUTOMATED SYSTEM WORKS

- 1 Items placed outside of carts will not be collected.
- 2 The carts should be placed at the curbside no later than 6:00 a.m. on collection day.
- 3 Carts should be placed with the handles and wheels facing towards your home.
- 4 Cart lids should be closed. Please do not overload.
- 5 Place carts side-by-side approximately 1 foot apart & at least 3 feet from any stationary object [i. e. vehicles, fire hydrants, trees]
- 6 Carts should be removed from the curbside within 12 hours after service.

## TEMPORARY COLLECTIONS

Larger waste collection containers [from 3 yards to 40 yards] are available for construction, clean-up projects and other disposal needs. For additional details or to arrange for a delivery of a large container to your residence or business, please call CR&R Customer Service.



## BULKY ITEMS

Items that cannot fit in your automated residential carts are considered bulky items. Common bulky items include but are not limited to:

- Couches
- Desks
- Chairs
- Mattresses
- Tables
- Patio Furniture

**NEW RESIDENTS:** If you are a new resident who is just moving in, you may contact our Customer Service Department in order to arrange for the collection of all your paper, cardboard, and other packing material at no additional charge.

## WHITE GOODS HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES

Household appliances containing Freon [i.e. air conditioners, refrigerators] as well as other white goods cannot be placed in your automated carts. CR&R will collect white goods from your curbside, similar to a bulky item. Other examples of white goods include:

- Refrigerators
- Freezers
- Dishwashers
- Ovens
- Water Heaters
- Stoves
- Washers/Dryers
- Air Conditioners

## E-WASTE

Electronic Waste [e-Waste] is anything powered by electricity or batteries. It is illegal to dispose of e-Waste in any of our automated carts. CR&R will collect and legally dispose of and recycle e-Waste along with our bulky items. To schedule an e-Waste pick up, please call CR&R Customer Service.

Examples of e-Waste include:

- Monitors
- Stereos
- Copiers
- MP3 Players
- Televisions
- Computers/Laptops
- Cell Phones
- Microwave Devices
- Digital Cameras
- VCRs/DVD Players
- Printers/Scanners
- Toaster Ovens

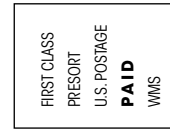
## HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

It is illegal to dispose of Household Hazardous Waste [HHW] in your CR&R carts. HHW are products that are flammable, corrosive, reactive or toxic. They are dangerous to the public and the environment. Household Hazardous Waste must be disposed of at a certified collection center.

Household Hazardous Waste includes, but is not limited to:

- Adhesives
- Cooking Oil
- Auto Batteries
- Used Motor Oil
- Sharps
- Dry Cell Batteries
- Solvents
- Painting Supplies
- Pesticides
- Automotive Products
- Herbicides
- Cleaning Products
- Insecticides
- Fluorescent Bulbs/Tubes
- Batteries
- Used Oil Filters

- Do not place trees in plastic bags
- Place tree in your green waste cart or beside your carts for collection
- Trees 6 feet or taller must be cut in half

**Palm fronds are not recyclable.**  
Please place cut palm fronds in the trash cart.

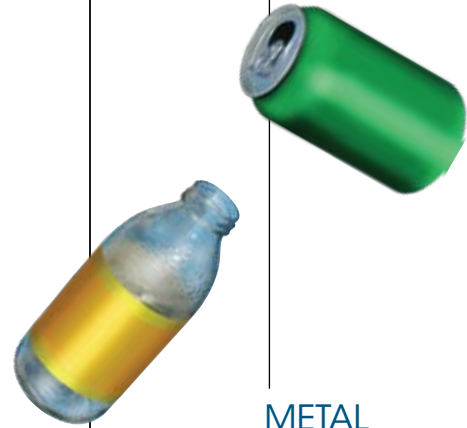


## REUSE
